IV. Roll Call of Commissioners

On the roll call the following Commissioners were present: Mr. S. Flancbaum, Mr. Waxman, Mrs. Fish and Senator Singer. Mr. S. Flancbaum was seated as an alternate. The following professionals were present: Mr. Norman Smith, Esq. and Mr. Gerwin Bauer, Jr. Auditor. Mr. Justin Flancbaum, Executive Director, Mr. Paul Morrill, Engineer, Mrs. Nancy Lapa, Secretary and Mr. Mark Hubal of Hatch Mott MacDonald.

V. SewerConnection Fee Hearing

Mr. Smith swore in Gerwin Bauer as the expert witness and established his identity as a Certified Public Accountant in the State of New Jersey and auditor of the Authority. Mr. Smith asked several questions regarding his preparation of the sewer connection fee schedule. The sewer connection fees were calculated in accordance with state regulations. The feesare reasonable and are satisfactory for the operation of the Authority to meet its budgetary needs. The fees were not changed from last year.

Mr. Smith swore in Mr. Mark Hubal as a witness and established his identity as a Licensed Engineer in the State of New Jersey. Mr. Hubal is a consulting engineer for the Authority. Mr. Smith also queried him as to his knowledge of the statutes and regulations regarding the computations of the sewer connection fees. Mr. Hubal prepared the schedule to be in compliance with the formulas set forth in the statutes. The fees are reasonable and aresatisfactory for the operation of the Authority to meet its budgetary needs. The fees were not changed from last year.
