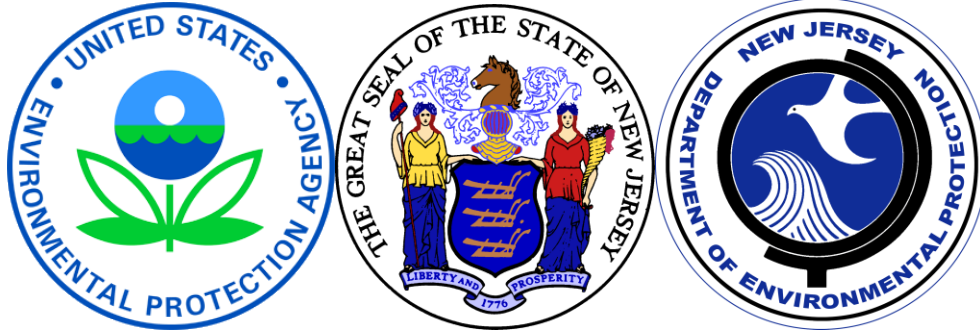




Construction of upgrades and improvements to Old Pine Acres Sanitary Sewer Project, Phase 2A, in Lakewood Township, New Jersey, totaling \$4,220,268.00, were financed by the New Jersey Water Bank (NJWB). The NJWB is a State Revolving Fund program jointly administered by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (NJIB) and uses a combination of funds provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the DEP, and the NJIB to provide very low interest loans to borrowers for environmental infrastructure projects.

This project will provide water quality benefits by providing the ability for existing homeowners to connect to a public sanitary sewer conveyance system and to remove their existing septic fields for in the neighborhood recognized as “Old Pine Acres” in the Township of Lakewood. Roads include Erica Road, Lucy Road, Colleton Street, Jeffery Street, Eisenhower Street, Stark Street, Marshall Street, and McArthur Street.
